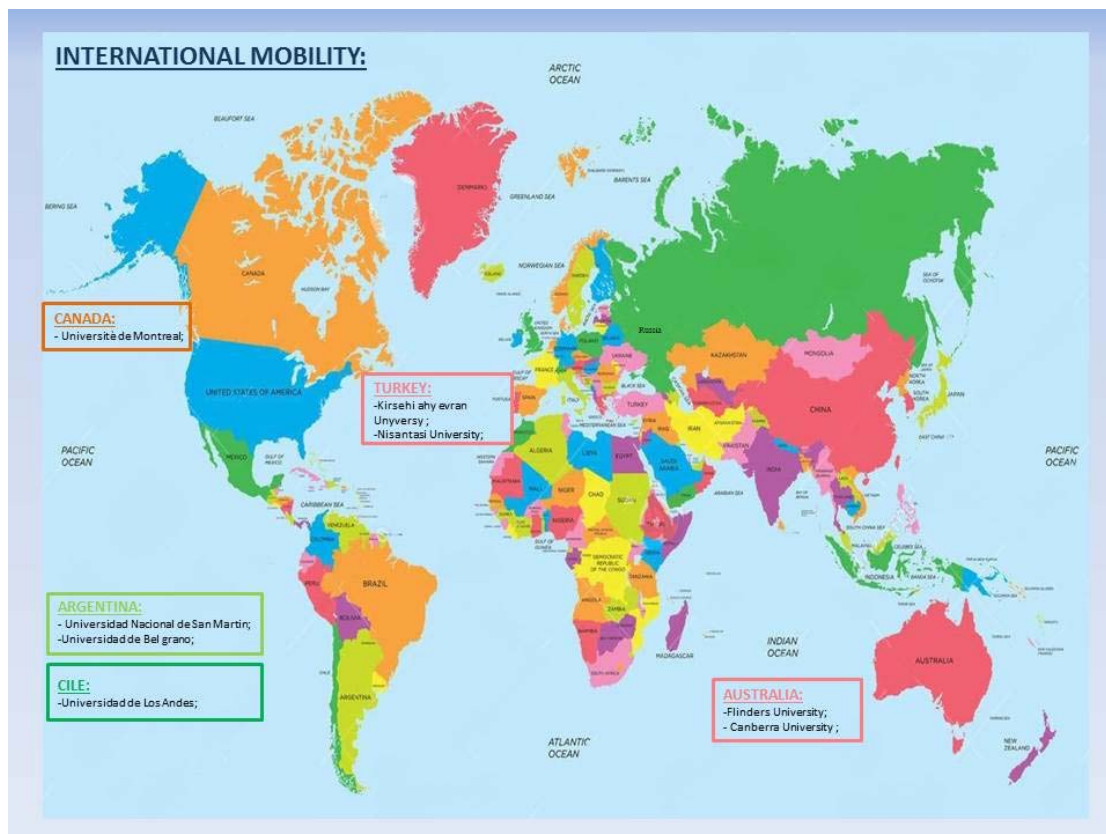


Since its founding in 1996, the Department of Political Science has a strong vocation for international and interdisciplinary studies. Our aim is to provide students with concrete employment opportunities, both in national and local public administrations, in the business world, and particularly in institutions, organizations and companies operating abroad, primarily within the European Union. This perspective follows the tradition of diplomatic studies, but with a renewed attention to all those work environments that have affinity with international relations. The international dimension is, in fact, a very specific feature of our Department and our research; every academic year foreign scholars from all over the world visit our institution to take part in meetings or conferences and to give lessons or seminars.

ERASMUS PLACEMENT: The Erasmus Placement Program allows both students and graduates to carry out a work placement (training, internship) within European countries and gives them the chance to acknowledge Academic recognition of the work placement (e.g. ECTS, Diploma Supplement or Transcript of records).

EXTRA EUROPEAN MOBILITY PROGRAM: The project offers scholarships for study and research activities for Undergraduate and Postgraduate students.

We are also entering into new agreements with : - University of Chejabinsk (Russia) - Lomonosov Moscow State University (Journalism and Global Studies) - Saint Petersburg State University (Faculty of History, Arts and Philosophy).



Also, our goals as International Relations Service is to directly involve students - both incoming and outgoing - before and after their mobility experiences.

With this aim in mind we created two blogs: one official (Ufficio Erasmus – Dipartimento di Scienze Politiche RomaTre), and one unofficial (Erasmus Point of View).

The first one is conceived as a further mean for spreading in the most effectively way official and bureaucratic information.

The second one is a web space where students can share their experiences abroad, can give their suggestions, or get in touch with other outgoing students.

Besides these two web spaces, we value direct contact with students too, through organizing welcome meetings for both incoming and outgoing students.

UNIVERSITY OF ESSEX:



The University of Essex is a British public research university whose original and largest campus is near the town of Colchester, England. It was established in 1963 and received its Royal Charter in 1965. The university is referenced by QS World University Ranking as a world leader in social science, with internationally recognised strengths in the humanities.

The International Academy offers a wide range of programs for students who need to improve their English before undertaking study in the University.

The Students' Union ensures that since you arrive at Essex you become part of the Students' Union family. Our friendly campuses are the perfect environment for Essex students to 'live and learn.' Each has facilities, support and entertainment right on your doorstep and less than one hour from London, airports and the beach.

UNIVERSITY OF ERFURT:



Erfurt is the capital of Thuringia. It is an important university, founded in 1932.

There is an extensive library divided into two sections (one in the center of the city and the other one in Gotha). Currently teaching and training focus on the arts and the humanities. There is a campus with restaurants, accommodations, a language center and a wi-fi area for studying.

Indeed, Erfurt University gives the chance to attend language courses for incoming students.

Ecolé normale Superieure de Lyon:



Situated in one of the most beautiful cities of France, the university of Lyon is associated with a strong French tradition of excellence and public service. It trains researchers and teachers in the sciences and the humanities. It is considered one of the three most prestigious French universities.

ENS Lyon pays special attention to the international arena, both in the study of the exact sciences, as well as in the humanities and the social sciences. The institute has over 300 international students, 67 nationalities represented on campus, 381 international partnerships in 26 countries. There are two campuses available for international students. Candidates in the arts, humanities and social sciences are invited to get a basic competence in French so as to be able to successfully undertake the courses they plan to attend.
